Hello players and parents/guardians.

Welcome to another exciting season of soccer!

It is the objective of Oceanside Football Club to:

- Foster, develop, promote and govern the game of soccer among youth within the Oceanside (School District 69) area.
- Encourage sportsmanship and emphasize fair play at all times
- Teach respect for officials, coaches and players at all times

Parents and guardians should set a positive example for the players at games, practices, and home by reaffirming these objectives.

Parents/guardians who register children under the age of 18 become members of OFC by paying the registration fee for spring or fall seasons.

Within OFC, coaching and Executive Board positions are filled by VOLUNTEERS. The society requires considerable volunteer commitment and respect for those volunteers from all members. The only paid positions within OFC are for the Registrar and the OFC Academy Head Coach (and his crew).

Every player should be given an equal opportunity to participate. It is the expectation that each player will play at least 50% of each game, provided they are physically and emotionally capable to do so. For more competitive teams playing within the Upper Island Soccer Association (Tier 3 and Tier 2), a minimum playing time is not guaranteed.

Complaints and Concern Procedure

If you are a parent/guardian and have a complaint or concern you would like to have addressed by the Club, follow these guidelines in order:

- Discuss the issue with your child's coach in private and in a friendly manner
- If the issue remains unresolved, write a letter to the Secretary and email to them or to the Registrar. Once received the letter will become official business and will be discussed at the next Board meeting.

Harassment

Parent Participation

Most teams need parent volunteers with jobs such as:

- Coaching
- Team manager
- Setting up and returning nets before/after games
- Cleaning up after practices and games
- Oranges/refreshments for players during games
- Helping the coaches as requested during games

Officiating

Our games are often refereed by Oceanside youth who are at various stages of learning to referee. The referee's call is final. No abuse of referees will be tolerated. Please encourage the young referees! If there is an issue with referees please contact the Oceanside FC Referee Coordinator.

Games and Practices

Ensure players arrive when requested by coaches, prior to games and practices, either ready to go or in time to warm up. Inform the coach if a child cannot attend a game or practice. Players are responsible to bring their own water bottles to games and practices. Advise the coach if a player has an injury or ailment.

Equipment Fees

Each player is either loaned a jersey (House League) or given a T-shirt shirt (Pony League). The cost of the jerseys is significant so please care well for it during the season and it must be returned at season's end. Players are required to provide their own soccer cleats, soccer socks, shorts and shin pads.

Registration fees go to the following:

- BC Soccer fees and insurance
- Jerseys, soccer equipment (balls, ball bags, coaches bags, nets, flags, cones, first aid kits, etc) Wages for referees and the Academy coaches
- Field lining
- Miscellaneous fees for meetings, office supplies, tournament expense

Only players registered AND paid are covered by insurance under BC Soccer insurance. Non-registered AND non-paid players are NOT allowed to participate in practices or games.
